This year we are trialling a more personalised approach to topic work, giving students more say in their learning. Topics will come from these broad contexts. These will be done throughout the year and will vary across the rooms.

ENGLISH will involve comprehension strategies for reading and character



writing

MATHS is Number concepts, especially place value. We will be grouping the children for Maths and English based on their learning needs, using their PAT results and the results from other diagnostic testing. These groups will not begin until

week 4, as the PATs happen week $3\cdot$ There are overlaps of needs between rooms and numbers are carefully organised to support learning.

R·E is going to be taught through a Social Justice perspective which will incorporate aspects from all strands· The whole long-term plan has this focus· <u>TECHNOLOGY</u> <u>Karori West Normal School</u>

Students have 3 blocks of 7 weeks· 11 is in Term 1 Weeks 2-8 On a Friday 9-12·30· 12 is in 11 Weeks 9+10 then 12 weeks 1-5 on a Thursday· 13 is in 13 week 6-10 and 14 weeks 1+2 on a Friday·

Some parents were contacted last year as Karori West Normal School have a limit of 16 children per room· There are 5 rooms meaning we can only take 80 students· Last year, 6 Y7 students volunteered to stay back for the first

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block. The other students staying back will be organized, either through choice or balloting, this term and you will be contacted if your child is one of them. These students will stay at school to do a separate programme around STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Maths) with a Sacred Heart Cathedral School teacher.

<u>**DANCE:**</u> This will be taught by specialists and will be done in a block during weeks 5 and 6

SATURDAY NETBALL: Those children wanting to play for the school will receive a separate newsletter soon. (This is run by a committee of parents.)

<u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u>: This term with fine weather we plan to get the children outside regularly. **P.E. gear is needed for this.** Children need to check with their teacher for their day(s). Please help them in this matter.

Please also make sure children do not come to school with jewellery or nail polish on (with the exception of watches, keepers, crosses and culturally significant jewellery)· Also please reinforce the wearing of school shoes to and from school; sun hats are required in Term 1 & Term 4·

HOMEWORK: This is set for about 40 minutes, 4 sessions a week Due to out of school commitments, the weekend is included to give more flexibility to time management. If there are reasons why children are unable to complete homework, please let the teacher know. All children have an IXL login for Maths and English. They are encouraged to keep a brief diary of time and activities done on these, which you could initial once a week. For students who do not have access to a computer at home, there will be an alternative programme provided. All children should read for at least 15 minutes a night and work on memorising Maths basic facts in all operations (+ - x ÷) plus factors, primes and squares.

We hope children will have a good year, beginning it with covered books, enthusiasm and high standards of work and behaviour. We will be working to maintain this and are confident you will support us in it.

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Dates for other outings will be in the school newsletter and on the school calendar, accessed through the App.
