The tour begins at Suzanne's Historic Crèche (now the Pukeahu Education Centre) in Buckle Street and continues to sites of significance in Suzanne's story, including the present day Compassion Soup Kitchen and St Mary of the Angel's, the church where Suzanne Aubert's funeral was held in 1926.
